### **Community Infrastructure Levy – Further Public Consultation on Responses to the Examiners Post Hearing Letter to East Hampshire ID-05**

East Hampshire District Council is intending to introduce a Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) in 2015. As part of the work towards implementing a CIL, the Council has produced a Revised Submission Charging Schedule and other documents which were subject to a Hearing in Public on 1st June 2015. At the hearing the Examiner requested a range of notes to explain a number of CIL matters and clarified the subject areas in the letter to East Hampshire from the Examiner dated 2nd June 2015, reference ID-05.

In accordance with the Examiner's wishes all of our responses to ID-05 will be subject to a 4 weeks consultation starting today.

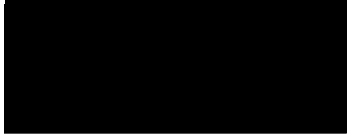
